The end of 2003 is nearing fast (too fast as far as I am concerned) but hopefully spring will be upon us before we know it. How's that for optimism!! Our membership secretary, Donna Leonessa, has done a great job getting us more automated in the membership department. She will be sending out a membership dues reminder to all current members so that there is no confusion on when dues are payable, and also to simplify the process for our members. Thanks Donna!!

Since we're on the topic of dues, as mentioned in an earlier edition of Centerline, we will be increasing dues for the coming year. As many of you are aware, USDF has taken a dues increase. As a result of this, the amount that our GMO must submit to USDF per member is also increasing. Up until this coming year CDA submitted \$10 of each member's dues to USDF. This will be increasing to \$17 per member. The CDA board had many discussions regarding the increase in dues proposal and it was noted that the costs to publish and mail Centerline and the Omnibus, maintain our website, and purchase the ribbons and awards for our schooling shows and Year-End awards exceeded the money we currently take in on dues, even without the additional fee paid to USDF. Therefore we have voted to also increase dues for the coming year.

We are in discussions with some new facilities that we are hoping to add to list of those whose schooling shows will be eligible for our Year-End awards. This should result in more riders having the ability to qualify for awards without having to drive a long distance to find a qualifying competition. Remember, it is not too late to have your favorite facility added to our list. If you call me at 860-283-8748, I will be happy to contact the facility and see if they are willing to meet the requirements to qualify their competitions for our Year-End awards.

“GETTING TO KNOW YOU.....”

Featuring CDA member Frederica Crafts

Recently 13 year-old CDA youth member Frederica Crafts shared some of her near-future riding goals: “When I am old enough I want to go to the North American Young Riders Championships. Next year, I would really like to make the Junior Team and ride the Junior Dressage Team Championships at Devon. Riding in the Olympics would be nice too!”

The 2002 competition season was very successful for Frederica and her leased horse Nabob Zimry. She recalls their experiences: “Zimry is a small Dutch Warmblood/Welsh cross who took me from First through Fourth level during the summer of 2002. We were second and third level Junior Champions for the CDA Year End Awards for 2002. We were also awarded third place in Second level and Junior Champion for Third level during the NEDA Year End Awards. I also got my USDF Bronze medal with him. Zimry was a wonderful teacher who allowed me to gain tremendous experience in shows. He also gave me a solid introduction to the upper level movements.”

Frederica lives with her parents in East Killingly, CT. In 2002, the horses Zimry and a 33 year-old Appaloosa mare, Hydrox Cookie are boarded close to home. Frederica (who is also known to others as “Freddie”, “Fraz”, or “Sophia”) trains at home with her mom, Sybille Crafts. At this time, Zimry is for sale and Frederica and her family are looking for a new horse. She explains that some of the criteria in their horse search include “no smaller than 16.1h, at St. Georges level and being a teacher and loyal friend with who I could pursue my goals.”

When not involved with horses, Frederica enjoys “talking on the phone or online with friends, shopping and hanging out with friends is good too!” Frederica introduced their additional ‘family members’ who include: “Nelly is a 6 year-old black/dark brown Mini Dachshund with a very distinguished nose for hunting any size animal! Ringa, our 11 year-old Rhodesian Ridgeback, whose loyalty to us and Nelly is unsurpassed. Bear, our cat, is a 3 year-old half-blind rescue. He loves to observe wildlife from inside the house or our porch. I think he has quite some imagination of being a fierce hunter!”

This fall Frederica will be entering the eighth grade at The Rectory School in Pomfret, CT. She explains, “My daily commute is about 15 minutes one way and my ‘chauffeurs’ are my parents! My favorite subject at school is Science, but Study Hall is nice too! Science is my favorite subject because it requires hands-on involvement. I feel that I am ‘doing’ something, other than just listening. I also enjoy History very much because it teaches me about the past. My focus for my 2004 school year is to receive good grades in class as well as on my tests.”

When she is not involved with Dressage, Frederica plays on the varsity soccer and basketball teams at The Rectory School. “Our teams play against other middle schools and often some high schools in the Hartford area or in Massachusetts.” This active thirteen-year-old also enjoys skiing and snowboarding in the winter. When asked about her favorite location to ski, Frederica recalls “My favorite place for skiing and snowboarding is a small, remote place in Austria at about a 6000 feet elevation, where they have no access roads but only miles of slopes to enjoy!”

Frederica recalls a recent highlight among her riding experiences: “In June, 2002, I went with Zimry to train with Lendon Gray for four weeks. After that, in the fall of 2002, I rode my first fourth level at NEDA. It was very exciting and a lot of fun. In October of 2002, I got to ride with Ralph Isselhorst and Ulla Salzgeber. After riding with Ulla, I received an invitation from her to come to Germany for the summer of 2003 and work at her facility. I spent almost 6 weeks during June and July of this year at “Dressurstall Salzgeber” where I worked with the staff, took care of the horses, went along to some local shows with the young horses, and received lessons on a great schoolmaster “Maggie”. I was also allowed to ride other FEI level horses. I was very lucky to have had the chance to ride a variety of horses I could learn from. At the moment I am ‘horseless’ and I can’t wait to apply what I learned this summer!”

Johann von Goethe wrote: “**What you can do, or dream you can do, begin it; boldness has genius, power and magic in it.**” This quote appeared in the July, 2003 issue of *Centerline* and it speaks to anyone of us who has goals and/or dreams either for tomorrow or years down the road. Frederica Crafts not only enjoys her active life as a teenager, equestrian, student and athlete but she has set goals for herself in school, sports and dressage. She also recognizes and appreciates the invaluable lessons that she has learned in her many riding experiences. Thank you, Frederica, for sharing your thoughts and dreams with CDA and we wish you good luck in your search for a new dressage partner.

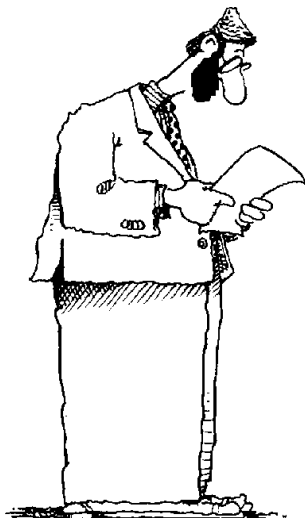
