USDF PRE-CERTIFICATION: TRAINERS ON THE RISE

The July and August 2010 issues of Centerline profiled a number of the USDF pre-certification cohort of talented professional trainers in order to introduce them to the New England dressage community. They are: Marie Banks, Jayne Marino, Suzanne Markham, Rochelle McPherson, Janet Youse, Nikki Noble, Alice Peterson, Paula Pierce, Lisa Pierson, and Lisa Weiss. This issue of Centerline concludes this series of pre-certification articles with the profiles of Suzanne Markham, Nikki Nobles, Alice Peterson, and Janet Youse. By the time this issue goes to press, all nine participants will have undergone the rigors of USDF certification testing. Centerline will feature the results of that process in a forthcoming issue.

Suzanne Markham. Suzanne Markham is from Suffield, Connecticut. She is a professional dressage trainer and instructs horses and riders of all levels for dressage. She has been riding almost all of her life thanks to continuous support from her parents and more recently from her wonderful husband. Suzanne began riding as a Hunter/Jumper rider then Eventing where she found Dressage. Over the years she has competed successfully thru the FEI levels, earning her USDF Bronze, Silver and Gold medals. She has ridden with some of the World's top trainers in order to continue her dressage education including Lendon Gray, Kyra Kirkland, Steffen Peters, Debbie McDonald, Henk Van Bergen and many others.

Nikki Nobles. Nikki Nobles has focused her professional career on dressage for the past 8 years. Nikki earned a degree in Animal Science from North Carolina State University. Afterwards, she became a working student for Linda Zang with whom she remained for 4 years. Nikki then began working for Lendon Gray when she made the decision to push toward the upper levels. Nikki also has a strong expertise is working with young and inexperienced horses.

Janet Youse. Janet Youse lives in northeast Pennsylvania with her husband, Larry. They have two young adult children, too many horses, four dogs and numerous barn cats. Janet began riding at age 4, attended 4-H as a teen, rode with the veterinarian, worked at a local Morgan farm and could not get enough time with horses. After graduation she traveled to England where she earned her British Horse Society Assistant Instructor's certification through Fulmer International. Janet then worked for a time for Carol Lavell in Vermont. She began instruction with Lendon Gray and for the next six years, she rode with Kathy Connelly of Massachusetts. Janet moved to Pennsylvania where she focused her energy on raising her family. During that time, she commuted to Massachusetts for lessons with Kathy Connelly several times a year. From 2006-2008, Janet worked with Gunnar Ostergaard. From 2008 to present, she has been riding with Scott Hassler of Chesapeake City, Maryland.

Tell me about the horse you are currently working with. How did you find each other, what have you achieved together thus far, and what are your hopes as partners together in future competition?

SUZANNE: "Donarlicht aka Donny" is a 10-year-old Hanoverian (De Niro-Highlight/Hohenstein) gelding. Suzanne feels "he is the most wonderful horse I have ever had the privilege of working with, a true partner and horse of a lifetime." She has owned him since he was a yearling and has done all of the training herself. The pair has competed successfully, winning regional championships and many national year-end awards. As a five and six year-old they enjoyed much success in the FEI young horse tests. In 2006

Place all trash in designated containers; no alcohol, please.

Times: Call the show secretary the **Friday** evening before the show between 6 - 9 P.M. or email: mchrisrogers@sbcglobal.net to have the schedule emailed to you. You will be able to view the ride times on the CDA Website on Saturday before the show.

Directions: From 1-91 North: Take exit 17 to 691 West. Take Exit 4 off 691W. Turn left at the end of ramp. **Turn right onto third residential street, Gwen Road. At the end of Gwen Rd. turn right onto Johnson Ave. Take the first left onto Finch Ave. Go 7/10 miles on Finch to Allen Avenue, turn left. Once Again Farm is 100 feet ahead on the right. “Donarlicht” was USDF Six year-old Horse of the Year. In 2008, the pair started competing in the USEF Developing Horse tests and finished the year ranked 6th. Suzanne and Don successfully competed at the Intermediare Championships held at Gladstone. They are now listed on the Developing Horse and Rider list. Suzanne states that “Don has a very competitive and focused attitude-his work ethic is amazing, coming out everyday ready to learn.” Suzanne and Don have moved up to Grand Prix successfully showing with an average score of 70%. Her short-term goal with “Donarlicht” is to finish this year competing him at a CDI at Grand Prix at NEDA Fall and Dressage at Devon. Suzanne states “Don and I are very excited by the possibilities for our future. We continue to work hard every day in order to see what lies ahead for us.”

NIKKI: Timmy is a 14-year-old Trakhener gelding. He came to me with a successful background in the hunter world. He has quite a few physical limitations, and his work life is different from other horses that I have in training. I have shown him successfully at First Level. The goal is to get his owner from Training to First Level next year. His comfort is first and foremost as we choose exercises to improve him.

JANET: I am currently showing 3 horses, which I train with Scott Hassler. Georgetown is a dutch/hann gelding, now 14. I bought him at 8 months. He is competing at PSG and I 1. This year has been his best with improved scores at I1. Masster is a 9 yr Trakehner g whom I purchased unstarted as a 5 yr old. He is currently competing at 3rd-4th levels. Arturo a tb/hann was purchased at 5 months and is showing very successfully at 2nd level. Most of my horses seem to find me. My goals are to train the horses to reach their highest potential. Each one of them is proving to have GP potential making the journey very exciting! I enjoy working with each of the horses and love seeing them develop over time.

It is safe to say you are at a new threshold in your career. In looking back, what would you do differently? What self-perceived mistakes might you remedy with different choices?

SUZANNE: I am very fortunate to have a great group of clients who support me 100 percent in my efforts to improve my dressage education. Each trainer that I have worked with has given me a new exercise to approach a training issue or a new approach on how to teach a training movement. I am thrilled to share all of this with my clients and their horses. The USDF Instructor program has also opened my eyes to different approaches for training horses and riders. I would encourage all dressage professionals to participate in the program to expand their knowledge.

NIKKI: Early on in my career I did not connect with enough professionals outside of my barn. I was very isolated and that held me back in terms of growth. I have found great opportunities by simply connecting with others who

have been on the same path, and I have found them to be surprisingly available!

JANET: I feel as though the instructor’s program and testing has come at the right time in my life. Having raised a family I now have more time to commit to workshops, seminars, symposiums etc. Many good things come in time and are well worth the wait. I look forward to learning more from the USDF programs along with all the other dressage related programs now available.

Think back to when you began as a trainer-participant in the pre-certification workshops. How has the process informed your point of view about the discipline and your approach to teaching riders and training horses?

SUZANNE: The USDF Workshops offered by CDA were fantastic. Each Workshop focused on a different area of the Instructor Program, Riding, Teaching and Lunging. During the Workshop we were able to practice with the USDF Faculty member encouraging us to try different exercises and techniques to ride, teach and/or lunge. My base of knowledge grew during the process and my clients and their horses are benefitting from all that I gained. Thank you CDA for running the program. I would encourage all dressage trainers to go through it.

NIKKI: This program has encouraged me to think more about the “how and why” of what I ask of my students. Often I have taken for granted that they possess a certain level of knowledge. I have also discovered the value of CORRECT lunging! It is not just an exercise for a fresh horse. So much about connection can be learned on the lunge.

JANET: I actually began the instructor’s workshops approximately 12 yrs ago, but due to family commitments was unable to finish the program. Each time I have attended a workshop I learned so much. Each instructor has their own style and new ways to say some of the same things. All of this helps when we return home and teach our students. Each student learns differently and as we enlarge our base of knowledge we can then share it with our students.

USDF and Platinum Performance Congratulate the 2010 NAJYRC Dressage Team and Individual Champions

The United States Dressage Federation is pleased to announce that Region 6 Young Rider, Jhesika Wells and Intrepid, were awarded this year's Fiona Baan "Pursuit of Excellence" Memorial Trophy. Traveling from her hometown of Marysville, Washington, Jhesika and Lyn Anderson's twenty-year-old, Dutch Warmblood gelding, Intrepid, earned double gold at this year's USDF/Platinum Performance North American Junior/Young Rider Dressage Championships at the Adequan FEI North American Junior/Young Rider Championships presented by Gotham North. By earning the highest score in the FEI Young Rider Team Test with a 69.263% she led her combined team of Region 5 and 6 to a gold medal finish. She reigned supreme again in the FEI Young Rider Individual Test with the top score of 70.000%, earning her second gold medal. Jhesika and Intrepid finished with a silver medal placing in the FEI Young Rider Freestyle with a score of 70.550%. Her combined average of all three tests put her in the top spot among the Young Riders and was awarded the Fiona Baan "Pursuit of Excellence" Memorial Trophy.

This award, which is on permanent display in the Roemer Foundation and USDF Hall of Fame, has been presented since 1994 to the young rider competing in the USDF/Platinum Performance North American Young Rider Dressage Championships that receives the highest combined average score for all three of their dressage tests; FEI Young Rider Team, Individual, and Freestyle.

The "Pursuit of Excellence" is the legacy Fiona Baan left to all the FEI Young Riders, and indeed to everyone who ever knew or worked with her. For nearly 30 years, Ms. Baan worked tirelessly with great dedication to the United States Equestrian Team (USET). She was US Dressage Team leader for the 1976 Olympics, in which the US won the Bronze Medal, the 1987 Pan Am Games, and for the Bronze Medal dressage team at the 1992 Olympics in Barcelona.

U.S. dressage riders took home 23 medals in the USDF/Platinum Performance North American Junior/Young Rider Dressage Championships at the Adequan FEI North American Junior/Young Rider Championships presented by Gotham North at the Kentucky Horse Park in Lexington, KY. The Young Rider Team Gold was won by the combined team of Regions 5 and 6 with members; Jhesika Wells and Intrepid, Brandi Roenick with Nobel, Madeleine Birch and Starlight and Laura DeCesari on Cheenook II, earning a total score of 199.842. The Canada-Ontario Team took home the Team Silver with Megan Lane riding Caravella, Jaimie Holland on Fleurina, Amy Jager with Key West, and Maura O'Sullivan riding Pik Czar earning a total score of 198.421. The Team Bronze Medal was won by the combined team of Regions 4

and 8 with Hans Baertsch on Rubinstar GB, Tessa Dick with Lord Chalk Hill, Mary Bahniuk Lauritsen riding Rossignol-ISF and Megan Davis on Bentley, with a total score of 196.421.

Jhesika Wells and Intrepid took home the Young Rider Individual Gold with a 70.000% while Silver and Bronze went to Canada-Ontario teammates, Megan Lane with Caravella and Jaimie Holland on Fleurina, earning 68.947% and 68.211%, respectively. The Young Rider Freestyle Gold medal was won by Team Canada-Ontario's Jaimie Holland and Fleurina with the top score of 72.700%. The Silver went to Jhesika Wells aboard Intrepid with a 70.550% and the Bronze was awarded to Megan Lane aboard Caravella from Team Canada-Ontario with a 70.350%.

The Junior Team Gold was won by Team Canada-British Columbia with a total score of 201.297 including; Esmee Ingham on Norseman, Slyvie Fraser with World Star LHF and Monica Houweling aboard Stentano. The Junior Team Silver was won by the Region 7 Team consisting of Meg Adams and N.A.S.H., Stephanie Early with Panash, Jamie Pestana on Winzalot and Geñay Vaughn aboard Waranja, earning a total score of 197.783. The combined team of Regions 3 and 4 took home the Team Bronze with a total score of 193.676. The team included; Clare Krska on Romincka, Alexandra Kitchen with Ronaldo, Rebecca Cohen on Downtown and Stephanie Bedford with Wahlen.

Region 7's Jamie Pestana and her own six-year-old, Hanoverian gelding, Winzalot, took home the Junior Individual and Freestyle Gold medals, earning a 71.105% in the Individual and the top score of 74.250% in the Freestyle. Catherine Chamberlain and Verdicci from Region 5 were awarded the Junior Individual and Freestyle Silver medals, with a 70.368% in the Individual and a 72.950% in the Freestyle. Region 3's Stephanie Bedford and Wahlen took home the Junior Individual Bronze Medal earning a 67.632% while Esmee Ingham and Norseman, representing the Canada-British Columbia Team, won the Junior Freestyle Bronze Medal with a score of 70.900%.

USDF and Platinum Performance wish to congratulate all of the 2010 NAJYRC Champions! Complete results can be found at www.youngriders.org.

The NAJYRC is the premier equestrian competition in North America for Junior and Young Riders, age 14-21. Teams are invited from the United States, Canada, Mexico and the Caribbean to compete for team and individual medals in the three Olympic disciplines of show jumping, dressage, eventing and the World Equestrian Games discipline of reining.

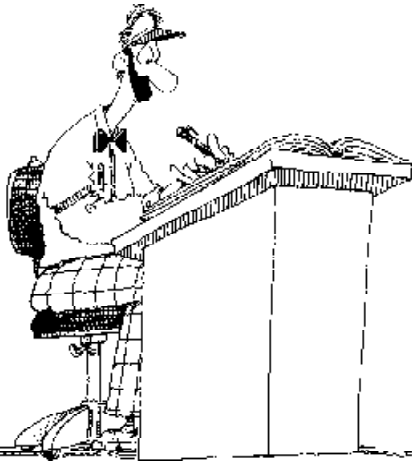

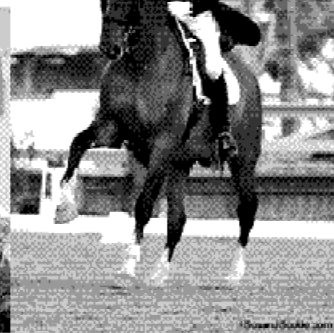
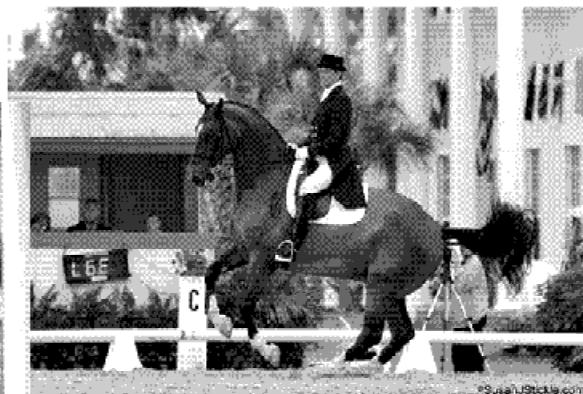
